Spotlight on Packed lunches brought from home should include:

- at least one portion of fruit and one portion of vegetables every day.
- meat, fish or other source of non-dairy protein (e.g. lentils, kidney beans, chickpeas, hummus and falafel) every day
- a starchy food such as any type of bread, pasta, rice, couscous, noodles, potatoes or other types of cereal every day
- dairy food such as milk, cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais every day

Packed lunches MUST NOT include:

ANY KIND OF NUT – including peanut butter and Nutella – because of the life threatening risk to any other child who may have a severe allergy.

Special diets and allergies

The school also recognises that some pupils may require special diets that do not allow for the suggestions to be met exactly. In this case parents are urged to be responsible in ensuring that packed lunches are as healthy as possible. For these reasons pupils are also not permitted to swap food items. Please also be mindful of allergies when handing out birthday treats.
