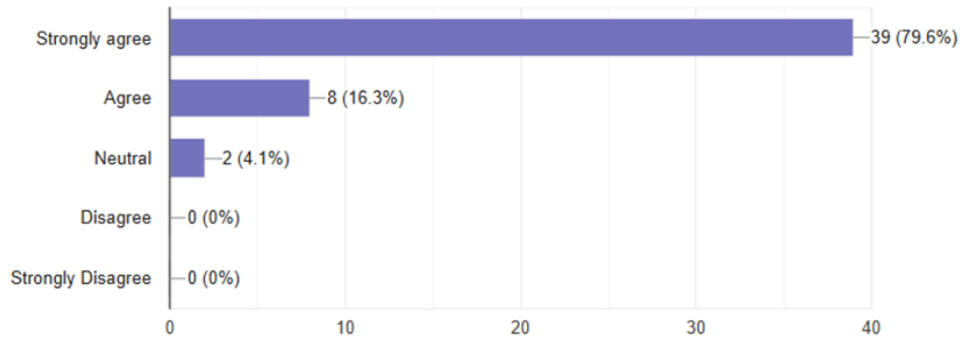


## Parents' Evening Feedback

Here are the results of the Parents' Evening Feedback Survey. Thank you to those who answered the questions.

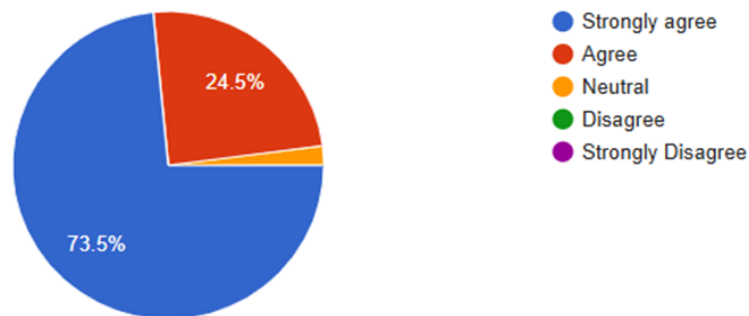
My child is happy and settled in their new class.

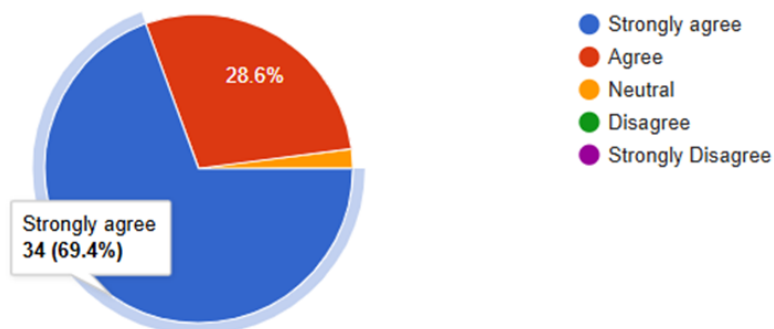
The information given at Parents' Evening was useful.

# Pantomime Relaxed Performance

### **So what is a Relaxed performance and who is it for?**

If you have learning or sensory disabilities, or care for someone who does, you'll understand how difficult it can be to attend a regular theatre performance. Our Relaxed performance has some small changes that will help: Lighting and special effects will be changed slightly - for example, removing strobes and flashing lights and reducing very loud noises. Lowering the volume for the whole show. Throughout the performance there will generally be a more relaxed attitude to noise and to the audience needing to leave and return to the auditorium. All cast, crew and staff are briefed to expect noise and additional audience movement so there is no undue concern over unexpected noises. During the show an area will usually be available as a quiet space to relax for those who need to leave and re-enter the auditorium during the show. Suitable for both adults and children including people on the autism spectrum, people who make involuntary noises and people with learning disabilities. Of course the show is as good, as funny, as entertaining and as spectacular as at any other performance!
